## Status of the Convention on the Rights of the Child

### Report of the Secretary-General

#### *Summary*

The General Assembly, by its resolution 44/25 of 20 November 1989, adopted the Convention on the Rights of the Child. The Convention was opened for signature in New York on 26 January 1990 and entered into force on 2 September 1990, the thirtieth day after the deposit with the Secretary-General of the twentieth instrument of ratification or accession. As at 30 June 2007, the Convention had been ratified or acceded to by 193 States.

By its resolution 54/263 of 25 May 2000, the Assembly adopted two Optional Protocols to the Convention. The Optional Protocols entered into force on 12 February and 18 January 2002, respectively. As at 30 June 2007, the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the involvement of children in armed conflict had been ratified by 116 States and signed by 122 States and the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the sale of children, child prostitution and child pornography had been ratified by 121 States and signed by 115 States.

## **I. Introduction**

1. In its resolution 61/146, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to submit to it at its sixty-second session a report containing information on the status of the Convention on the Rights of the Child. The present report is submitted in accordance with that request.

## **II. Status of the Convention on the Rights of the Child**

2. As at 30 June 2007, the Convention on the Rights of the Child had been ratified or acceded to by 193 States. In addition, two States had signed the Convention.<sup>1</sup>

3. As at 30 June 2007, the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the involvement of children in armed conflict had been ratified by 116 States and signed by 122 States and the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the sale of children, child prostitution and child pornography had been ratified by 121 States and signed by 115 States.<sup>1</sup>

## **III. Implementation of the Convention on the Rights of the Child**

4. During the reporting period, the Committee on the Rights of the Child held its forty-third to forty-fifth sessions at the United Nations Office at Geneva, from 11 to 29 September 2006, 15 January to 2 February 2007 and 21 May to 8 June 2007, respectively.

5. Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 59/261, the Committee met in two chambers during its forty-third session and in plenary during its forty-fourth and forty-fifth sessions. The Chairperson of the Committee will present to the General Assembly at its sixty-second session an assessment of the working methods and the progress made, including in particular the experience of the two-chamber working method and the views of the Committee on ways of further improving its working methods.<sup>2</sup>

6. In conformity with rule 75 of its provisional rules of procedure, the Committee on the Rights of the Child has decided periodically to devote one day of general discussion to a specific article of the Convention or to a theme related to the rights of the child in order to enhance understanding of the content and implications of the Convention. At its forty-third session, the Committee devoted its day of general discussion to the theme of child participation in accordance with article 12 of the Convention. Following the general discussion, the Committee adopted a set of recommendations (see CRC/C/43/3).
